Your submission should include two files:

- A *draft poster* (formatted for A4) in PDF.
- An *extended abstract* following the formatting guidelines detailed below.

### Formatting:

- Extended abstracts may be **at most** 1 page long, including references.
- Please use this latex template for submission as well as the camera ready version. The template complies with the SYSTOR typesetting guidelines.
- Categories and subject descriptors are required for the camera-ready version only. You can choose not to include them in your submission.
- Make sure all fonts are embedded in the resulting PDF file.

## 2 INSTRUCTIONS FOR ACCEPTED POSTERS

- You are responsible for printing your *poster* and bringing it to the conference to be presented at the poster session. The presented posters should be of standard poster sizes 70 x 100cm or 90 x 120cm.
- Authors will be individually contacted by ACM with instructions on submitting the rights management form.
- The finalized PDF of your *extended abstract* should be labeled as *SYSTOR20\_“Lead Author”.pdf*, and submitted by email, following the instructions at <http://www.systor.org/2020/cfp.html>.
- The deadline for submitting the final *extended abstract* and ACM electronic copyright forms is 11:59pm Pacific Daylight Time (PDT) **May 4, 2020**.
